This virus, which remains a potentially deadly threat, can only be defeated if we all work together in everything we do to break the chain of infection. For the safety of the staff and children in school if I believe any child returning has not been sticking to the guidelines in place and not socially distancing, they will not be permitted to come into school. Thank you for your understanding.

Please be with everyone returning to school in the next week. Help them to feel your peace and to be prepared for learning and friendships to be renewed.


