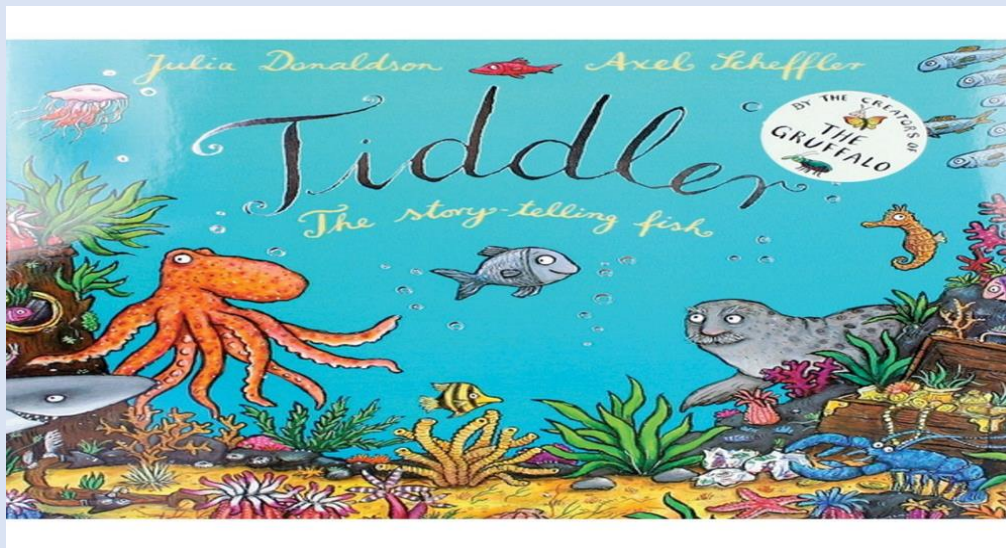

Maths

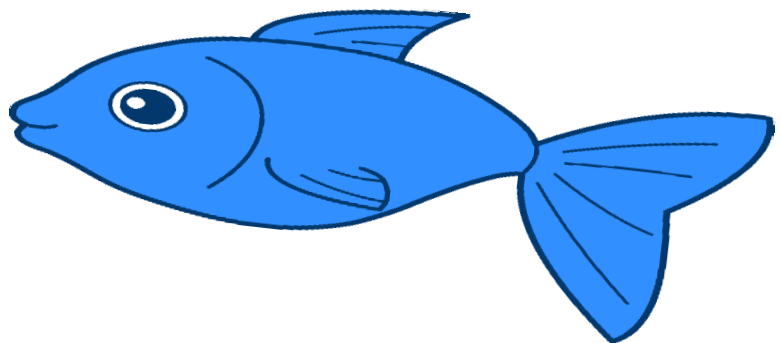


Let's have fun

total.









You are amazing!

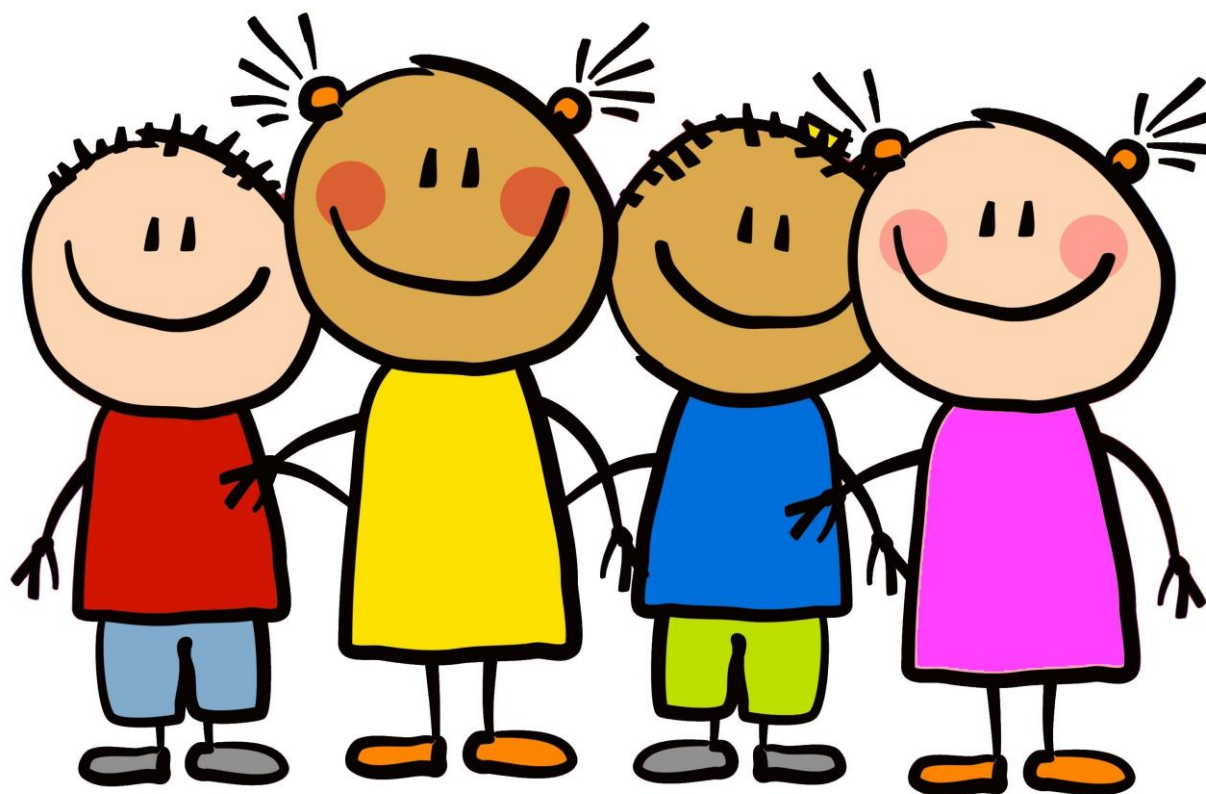
