
















Water bottles.

Books will be returned to children by 9th October with all work marked, as this gives enough time for them to be quarantined as they come in and as they then go back out.



### **Badgers Class!**


What a fantastic start to the term!

This term in Rabbits we are getting to know each other and settling in. We will be reading lots of favourite stories about families and finding out all about the children and their families. Later in the term we will be finding out about people who help us like doctors, vets and policemen and women.






This term in Squirrels, our topic is 'Once Upon a Time.' As part of this the children will be learning about castles in History. In English, we will be reading a variety of traditional tales. In Maths, we are getting up to speed with place value and counting. In Science, we will be learning about the parts of the body and the senses. The children have settled in well this week and they have shown how creative and eager they are to learn.

Foxes class has made a great start to the term. They have been working incredibly hard and have already earned themselves the nickname 'Fantastic Foxes'!

This term our topic is Globetrotters and we will be learning about brave explorers such as Marco Polo and Captain Cook. We will be using maps and atlases to chart their journeys and learn about new and interesting places. In English, our main text is 'Ice Trap', written by Meredith Hooper. The story is all about a brave explorer called Ernest Shackleton who wanted to be the first man to cross the Antarctic on foot. In Maths this term our topics are number, place value and simple addition and subtraction of 2 and 3 digit numbers. Our topic for Science is forces and magnets and we hope to be carrying out our own investigations. Our topic in RE is called 'People of God' and we will be finding out what it's like to follow God, and exploring bible stories that illustrate this.









What a fantastic start to the term! All Badgers have settled in quickly to the new routines and are concentrating well with their learning. This term we will be reading our class book "The Highland Falcon Thief" and taking inspiration from this book to help us with our writing. In Maths we will cover number and place value all the way to a million. This topic includes adding and subtracting up to 4 digit numbers using an exchange and roman numerals! Our topic is Changes, we will investigate what has changed in Britain and how this benefits us. Our Science follows on from our topic and is all about changing materials, we have already learned how electricity can bring change and throughout the term we will investigate how materials change state and can be separated. RE is all about how life can be considered a journey and how this idea relates to religions around the world and our own lives.

The children have made a good start to life in Owls class, they've worked superbly and their attitude has been first class. We have also been very proud of how they have behaved and adhered to the rules put in place - we are very excited about the year ahead and it is great to be back.

This term our topic will be World War 1 and we will be reading the book "Private Peaceful". In Maths, to begin with the children will be doing a lot of work on number to recap on what they have been previously taught and further that knowledge. PE is on a Monday and Thursday, so children need to come to school in PE kit and on a Friday it is Life Skills, where they will be learning the skills of gardening and the produce that comes from gardens. Some Fridays the children will need to come to school wearing suitable clothes for outdoor learning but we will inform you in advance. Our topic for Science this term is Electricity.
