



This week has been anti-bullying week and we have spent some of our PSHE and worship time discussing how our actions and what we say can affect others. Around the school, it is fantastic to see children showing our values of friendship and respect, reflecting the inclusive, tolerant community we wrote about in our new school vision. This does not happen only in anti-bullying week, but throughout the curriculum and each week, we celebrate the children who show these values and remind the children of the expectations.

We also talk with the children about their online behaviour, and remind the children how to keep themselves safe when they are online, at school and at home. We use 3Cs to help the children remember:

Conduct – treat people online, and when messaging, as if they were in the same room as you. Only say what you would say face-to-face.

Content – If you see something you are worried about, tell an adult straight away

Contact – only talk to people you know away from the screen. Do not accept requests from people you don't know and never share your full name, address or school.

We know a lot of our children use online tools and apps to communicate and play after school and so we ask you, as parents, to always monitor children's use of phones, internet use and game consoles, and remind them of the 3Cs to keep them safe. This week we've had a message from Kent Police about national safety concerns over a new gaming app 'Cunch Lines' and we ask you to ensure your children are not using this game. If you have any concerns and need help to talk with your child about their online behaviour, please talk to Mrs Nunn or Mrs Hammond.

Finally, it has been another quiet but productive week at school, with children working hard and learning new skills. We look forward to welcoming our Owls back next week.



Should I send my child to school?



With the changing seasons, it is inevitable that we will all start to get coughs and colds. Parents are now finding it harder than ever to decide if they should keep their child home. Please see the guide below to help you in making this decision.

With the symptoms your child is displaying, would you have kept your child off school before covid-19?

Keep your child off school.

Keep your child off school and at home.

Speak to 119 or go to the www.gov.uk/coronavirus website and arrange for a self-test to be done.

Your child and your household must self-isolate until you have the result of this test.

Do they have:

 A new, continuous cough? (Coughing a lot for more than an hour or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours – if you normally have a cough, it may be worse than usual.)
