


Attendance

It has been amazing to see so many children and parents joining us for our Christmas services this week. Each one was unique and personal to the class and it was a privilege to be in each service. Next term we are learning all about 'Amazing Animals'. We will be looking at wild animals and pets and hoping to meet some real life animals (pets not wild animals!). We have lots of stories to support our learning, from rabbits, to bears, dogs and cats.

In Term 3 Miss Reeve will be continuing her teacher training at Kingsnorth Primary. We wish her well and look forward to seeing her back in Rabbits Class in Term 4.

Next term, our Topic is 'Land Ahoy.' We are going to be Pirates so we will be focusing on Geography. We will be making our own maps, using compasses to navigate the stormy seas as well as looking at the oceans of the world and learning about weather and weather charts. We are also going to have lots of fun and exciting art activities, such as painting and collages as well as exciting DT projects. We will be making boats and compasses and testing our map skills through this. In addition to this, we will be looking at weather in Science and how weather changes. This will be a very exciting topic! I hope you have your Pirate hats at the ready!

We also welcome Mr Goodsell into Squirrels Class for Term 3 as part of his teacher training. He will be working along side Miss Macmillan.

Foxes Class have had a good term 2 and have worked really hard. We wish the children a well-deserved holiday and a good rest before we begin our fun filled learning for term 3. Our new topic will be the Romans and our class text is Escape to Pompeii by Christina Balit. The children will learn about events surrounding Pompeii and the volcanic eruption of Vesuvius. In Maths we will be continuing to become more confident at multiplication and division calculations. In RE our new topic is Incarnation where we will be discussing the question 'What is the Trinity?'. In science, our new topic is Light and we will be learning about how we see things and also designing our own experiments to find out how shadows are formed.





We are excited to start the new year with the topic of refugees. We will investigate some famous refugees, why people move and what makes them choose certain destinations. We will use this topic to broaden our knowledge of continents and countries. In English we will be using a picture book called The Journey to inspire our writing along side The Boy at the Back of the Class. In maths we will be learning how to multiply up to 4 digits by 1 digit. We then move on to learning about fractions and of course the daily times table practice will continue. In science we will look at how animals and humans 'work' and what we need to survive. Our R.E. will make us consider how Moses has affected Christian beliefs and whether as a race we can find freedom and justice from these teachings.

We hope you have a lovely Christmas and New Year. We can't wait to see you all again in 2021!

In term 3 our topic will be 'Migration' and we will be exploring the reasons and effects of the same. As Owls class enjoyed reading Michael Morpurgo in term 1, we will be indulging in another one of his novels next term. In Maths, we will be learning algebra and geometrical concepts alongside continuing to consolidate learning from previous two terms. For science we will be focusing on our unit 'Animals including humans' and learning about Islam in RE. In art the children will be looking a bit deeper into who they are and how to show that through Art.

We would like to congratulate Owls class for showing great resilience during these difficult times and would like to wish them and their families a very enjoyable Christmas! Be safe and see you soon!
