





Flatten out then on the bottom layer label 'Producer' in one third, write the name in another then draw it in the final third.


On the second layer write 'Primary Consumer' write the name of an animal the next step up on the food chain.


Finally, repeat the steps for layer 1 and 2 for layer 3, but label it 'Predator'.
