
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## Attendance

Next term in Rabbits we are planting and growing! Our topic is called 'How Does Your Garden Grow' and we will be finding out what plants need to grow, looking at seeds and growing as many plants as we can. Our main story will be 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We will also be finding out the names of common plants and flowers. Donations of seeds, pots, seed trays and compost would be hugely appreciated.

This term Squirrel's topic is 'Mad about Minibeasts.' We will be linking this topic to all aspects of our learning. Our main text will be 'The Bad Tempered Ladybird'. In Science, we will be learning about classifying animals. In Art and DT, we will be building and creating our own minibeast habitats such as a Wormery and a Bug hotel. In addition, our Geography will be focused on the local area and so we will be learning about urban map symbols, as well as exploring Charing and all of its history. In music, we will be learning how to compose music using minibeasts to help us. This will be a very exciting term filled with lots of fun activities. Miss MacMillan, Mrs Young and Mrs Dyson are looking forward to seeing all the Squirrels back after Easter.

Thank you to Foxes class for the brilliant way they have worked since returning to school. We are so impressed with your commitment and enthusiasm! Our new topic in term 5 will be the Romans and our class text is Escape to Pompeii by Christina Balit. The children will learn about events surrounding Pompeii and the volcanic eruption of Vesuvius. In Maths we will be learning how to order, compare and recognize equivalent fractions. Also, we will be learning how to tell the time and how to read the 24 hour clock. In science, our new topic is Light and we will be learning about how we see things. We will ask our own questions and design our own experiments to find out the answers.





Next term our topic focus will be Evolution and how life on earth has changed. We will investigate fossils and what they can tell us about living creatures from millions of years ago, how they have changed over time and why this might be. We will focus on the work of Charles Darwin and his amazing contribution to the study of evolution.

All our writing is going to be based on the book Skellig by David Almond: this award-winning book follows a 10-year-old boy as he brings a strange creature back to life. We'll be doing some gardening in Life Skills and learning what plants need in order to thrive. In maths we will be learning about shape and their properties including angles and symmetry as well as continuing our work on place value.

Enjoy your break, eat all the chocolate and have a lovely rest. We can't wait to start term 5 in school together. Happy Easter!
