

## Charing CE Primary School EYFS Newsletter Term 1 2025-26






## **Ducklings**






## **Rabbits**

For your child's first term in Reception, our focus will be on settling the children into our new routines, building positive relationships with them and developing the children's behaviour for learning. Our books this term are:













Our continuous provision and play will be dictated by our 'story of the week' and our learning will focus on themes from these stories such as families, relationships, autumn and sensory experiences. We will also begin learning the first sounds in our Read Write Inc. Phonics programme and in Maths we will be developing a deep understanding of numbers 1 to 5, learning to identify 2D shapes and to copy and complete simple patterns.

As October is Black History Month, we will also focus on 'Mo Farah' for one week with our story being 'Ready, Steady, Mo!' We will begin our **PE lessons** on **Wednesday 1**<sup>st</sup> **October** and children will need to come to school in their PE kit on this day with trainers on. Every child will also need a pair of plimsoles; please can the children bring them in where they can stay at school. Our focus in PE will be on the 'fundamental movement skills' this term. These gross motor skills are essential for children to develop their physical literacy to become competent and confident movers. We are so looking forward to this year and can't wait for the children to share their learning with us and with you!
